Dr Claudia Schneider is a Research Associate at the Winton Centre for Risk and Evidence Communication and in the Department of Psychology at the University of Cambridge, UK. She received her PhD in Psychology from Columbia University and held a graduate research scholar position at Princeton University prior to moving to Cambridge. Her research is motivated by the goal of helping to tackle society-level social issues, such as climate change and public health challenges. She investigates what shapes human decision making and behaviour in these contexts. A particular focus lies on the communication of scientific evidence, particularly relating to the disclosure of uncertainty and evidence quality, and the psychological factors underlying trust, decision making and behavioural response to such communications.


