Japanese stone monuments and disasters memory – perspectives for DDR

Garnier and Lahournat focused on an often-overlooked aspect of disasters: *disaster memory* both as a *prevention tool* and for potentially contributing to the *resilience* of vulnerable communities in Japan. Their study explored one specific source of disaster memory in Japan, namely the *disaster-related stone monuments* scattered throughout the islands.
