

(Copernicus Climate Change Service; February 2025)



This [Copernicus Climate Change Service](#) (CCCS) report presents consolidated global climate indicators for **2025**, including **surface air and sea temperatures, heat stress, and polar sea ice extent**. The year ranked **among the warmest on record**, with widespread temperature anomalies, record-low February sea ice, elevated sea surface temperatures, and persistent heat stress, underscoring accelerating long-term warming trends.
