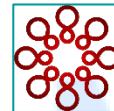

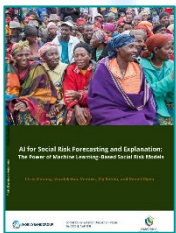

AI for social risk forecasting and explanation

(World Bank; April 2026)



This report by the [World Bank](#) presents three **proof-of-concept AI-based models** using multimodal data—satellite imagery, economic indicators, and NLP from news and social media—to predict conflict, migration, and crime. The models reveal interactions between climate stress, economic conditions, and social perceptions, improving early warning systems. Effective AI use depends on access to dynamic data. Models reached up to **76% accuracy forecasting violence** in eastern Democratic Republic of Congo and over **70% for migration** in the Horn of Africa, supporting better risk monitoring, anticipatory action, and targeted interventions in vulnerable regions.
