Loss and damage beyond economics

(UNEP; June 2026)

The report by **United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP)** systematically assesses how health-related Loss and Damage (L&D) is reflected in national climate policy documents. While health considerations, particularly in adaptation planning, are increasingly recognised, significant gaps persist in operational responses, financing, and implementation. The findings highlight the need to strengthen policy pathways addressing physical health, mental health, health systems, displacement, and climate vulnerability.
